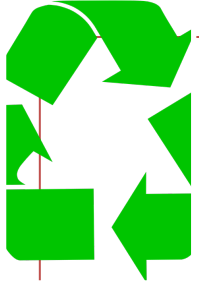


Integrated Waste Management Plan - IWMP



OBJECTIVES OF THE PGIR



Strengthen the strategies defined by TGI S.A. ESP focused on sustainable development through adequate integrated waste management.



Establish procedures, guidelines, and internal indicators for the proper management of waste



Estimate the reduction percentages for the different types of waste generated in operation and maintenance activities.



Identify strategies to prevent and minimize the generation of non-usable waste that is subject to final disposal in landfills.



Manage the resources to ensure timely and adequate waste management



SCOPE OF THE IWMP

The PGIR of **TGI S.A. ESP** is a guide for the implementation of actions focused on the integrated management of solid and liquid waste. This plan will be implemented in the administrative and operational headquarters of TGI S.A. ESP., and will be executed by the direct collaborators, contractors and personnel involved in their management, taking into account the stages of generation, storage, collection, transport, treatment, use and/or final disposal of the same.



GOALS DEFINED IN THE IWMP

- Deliver, use and manage at least 2% of the usable waste generated in the Company's Work Centres.
- Reduce at least 1% of the liquid RESPELs generated in the Company's operation and maintenance activities.



CLASSIFICATION OF WASTE GENERATED BY TGI S.A. ESP IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE IWMP

Hazardous Waste - RESPEL

Those wastes that, due to their intrinsic characteristics (corrosive, reactive, explosive, toxic, flammable) can cause damage or unwanted effects to health or the environment (**Red bin**).

Non-usable waste

Waste that, due to its characteristics or non-hazardous nature, is not susceptible to use and ends up in landfills (**Black bin**).

Usable Waste and Organic Usable Waste

material, object or element that has no use value for the generator, but that is susceptible to use to rejoin a production process; they can be **organic (green bin)** or plastic, glass, cardboard, among others (white bin)



GOOD OPERATIONAL PRACTICES IN TGI DEFINED IN THE PGIR



Generation

Avoid the use of disposable containers
Avoid mixing hazardous and non-hazardous waste



Segregation

Keep disposal containers identified
Schedule characteristic waste delivery days



Storage

Monitoring and control of the areas set up for this activity
Maintain safety data sheets for reagents, chemicals, among others



Use

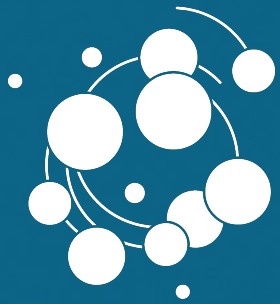
Identify usable waste collection companies in the area
Evaluate the option of returning to suppliers (reverse logistics)



Monitoring

Track paper consumption
Waste generation (environmental indicators)
